How to Receive Holy Communion Properly

- 1) When a person approaches the altar to receive Communion, they should bow their head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence.
- 2) As the Sacred Host is offered to us, the priest, deacon or Minister of the Eucharist says "The Body of Christ." The proper response is to say "Amen"., which literally means, "I believe." Nothing else should be said. *If a person does not believe in the presence of our Lord in the Eucharist, or if they are not in the state of grace, they should not receive. Instead, they should consider crossing their hands over their heart, and receiving a blessing.* But if they do believe, they need to choose whether to receive the Body of Christ in their hand or on their tongue.
- 3) If their choice is to receive in the hand, a communicant should be guided by the words of St. Cyril of Jerusalem: "When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart. Rather, place your left hand as a throne, over your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost."


Once the Host is placed on the palm of your hand, step to the side and with your other hand, reverently place the Host in your mouth. Always remember to consume the Host **before** starting to walk back to your pew.

It is improper and careless to receive our Lord one handed or with just two fingers.

- 4) If a person's choice is to receive the Eucharist on their tongue, after responding with an audible and heartfelt "Amen," they should tilt their head back and stick out their tongue. Ministers will appreciate it if you open wide! The priest or minister will then place the Host on the tip of their tongue.
- 5) After receiving, do not go to the bathroom. Don't leave church and head to your car because the Mass isn't over yet. Return to your pew without stopping to talk to friends because it's impolite to talk with your mouth full, especially with the Eucharist. Once you return to your pew, pray mightily to the One you were privileged to have just received.

Father's Day Food for Thought

Did you know that back in 1994, there was a Swiss study which gave insights to the trends among church goers? It didn't matter to what religion a person belonged, the study provided a wide-range of family scenarios as well as data for a variety of family situations. For example: what happens if the mother is practicing her faith and the father is not? What happens if only the father is practicing? The results might surprise you because they seem to suggest that children follow the example of dad!

- If *both* mom and dad go to church faithfully, 33% of their children will grow up to be regular attending members of the church.
- If only mom is taking the kids to church, only 2% of children will become lifelong church-goers, while 37% will attend occasionally. An excess of 60% of her children will end up leaving the church.

What happens if dad is active, but mom is not? Curiously, the numbers seem to go up. As previously stated, 33% of children remain when they see both mom and dad going to church every Sunday. But the number grows to 38% with an active dad and an occasionally active mom. Surprisingly, it continues to go up to 44% when it's just dad taking the kids to church! To sum up the data: if dad does not attend every Sunday, only 1 in 5 of his children will remain in the church.



God told Adam that it was time to populate the Earth. "Adam, you can start by kissing Eve."




Adam looked puzzled at God, "Lord, what's a kiss?" God explained, and then
