

Our community is offering a grace-filled volunteer opportunity that can draw you closer to God. We need sacristans to share the duties of the dedicated sacristans we already have.

What is a sacristan? It comes from the Latin word, 'sacer,' which means 'sacred.' So, sacristans should be prayerful men and women, content with working behind the scene and who bring to mind the words of Christ when He said that we should not do good works to gain accolades.

Some of their responsibilities include preparing the sacred vessels before and after Mass and making sure that our priest has everything he needs for the liturgy: towels and linens, cruets with water and wine and fresh candles on the altar. And this is just a small sample of their important responsibilities! Their chores should always be done in a prayerful way, under the guidance of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal and the pastoral discretion of the pastor.

Fr. Joe will be happy to welcome and personally train those who are interested in helping. Volunteers are required to be practicing Catholics, 16 years or older and current in their Safe Environment Training.

Our little church will be so beautiful when the painting is complete! Keep praying that our Creator will continue to inspire our artists, Nadiya and Vera, and guide the work of their hands! We just wanted to answer a couple questions from parishioners.

WHAT HAPPENED TO OUR TABERNACLE AND CROSS?

Both needed to be temporarily moved so that Nadiya and Vera could begin painting a depiction of ancient Jerusalem where the cross will hang. This one painting should take approximately 3 weeks to complete, at which time the tabernacle will take its' rightful place directly behind the altar and the same crucifix above it and with the new painting of Jerusalem in the background. You should notice that Nadiya and Vera will be "touching up" the crucifix, adding some shadows and highlighting our Lord's blood.

IS THERE A SPECIAL MEANING TO THE BIRD ON THE CEILING?

Yes, there is. If you have ever visited an ancient church in Europe, you might have seen a similar painting. The bird is not a swan or a stork, but actually a pelican which, for many centuries, has been a Christian symbol representing Christ and His selfless love. "But why a pelican" you ask? Because it was believed that a pelican would pierce its' own breast with its' beak and feed its' young with its' blood.



It is so important that we know our faith and its' history. We hope you consider joining the next Bible Study in order to learn what all the gestures and words mean whenever we celebrate the Holy Mass. Or consider being a part of this year's OCIA. Even the most active, lifelong Catholics realize that they don't know it all! *Never stop learning.*

WHEN WILL THE PROJECT BE DONE?

Historical accounts indicate that Michaelangelo didn't like painting the Sistine chapel because his preferred medium was sculpting, and painting for him, particularly on his back, was painful and physically exhausting. Can you imagine being on your back, so high in the air for seemingly endless hours and days? Supposedly, when someone asked him how much longer it would take to finish the chapel ceiling, he said, "as soon as I can get down from this damn scaffolding!" Its' tough to put a timeline on this project that will inspire people for many generations. We'll be happy when its' done, even if it takes until after Christmas.

Our Understanding and Cooperation is Needed and Appreciated

During the next phase of the painting of our Sanctuary, it was necessary to temporarily relocate the Blessed Sacrament to a tabernacle in Father Joe's vesting sacristy.

Because of the presence of our Eucharistic Lord, Father respectfully asks that only scheduled ministers be allowed in the sacristy in order to prepare for the next Mass. We will still genuflect in front of the tabernacle and once vested and ready, ministers and servers will proceed to the back of the church. *There should be no congregating in the sacristy and a reverent silence will need to be kept at all time.* The same respectful behavior we show our Lord in His sanctuary, will now be shown in His sacristy.

Take Up Your Cross

When I'm interviewing people for my job as a staff writer at an archdiocesan newspaper, I like to ask them this question: at the end of your life, when you meet God, what do you want to hear Him say?

I've gotten a lot of interesting answers.

"I called and you listened."

"What tee time would you like tomorrow?"

"What were you thinking?"

"Your servant made things better."

It's a question I've thought a lot about, personally. What I want to hear God say when I finally see His face is this: "You can put it down now."

When Jesus asks His disciples "Who do you say that I am?" He is not just asking them to verbalize an answer. He is asking them to do something: pick up the cross. Find the problems in this world, in this life, and throw your arms around them. Drag them to God, even if it kills you. It's not enough to stand by the sidelines, watching Christ ascend to Calvary, nodding your head in approval. Yes, I agree. Yes, I believe. Yes, Jesus good job! You have to follow in every bloody footprint He leaves in the dust. Set your face like flint. And when you meet Him at the top, you better not be empty-handed. He has a cross, He will expect you to have one, too.

I hope that I can do it. I hope that I am strong enough. I am not one of those great, hardy souls. I stumble terribly under the weight of my very small cross. I grumble as I shift it from shoulder to shoulder. But every time I have been almost at the point of giving up, almost ready to lay it down, there is something—Someone—who supports my drooping arm. **The Lord God is my help.**

If, at the end of everything, I hear the words, "You can put it down now," then I will know I have made it. I will know I have not failed: I took up the cross.


