

Romans 8:38-39

"For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

This quote is powerful because it reassures us that nothing, not even death, can separate us from God's love. When fear of death arises, this verse reminds us that our relationship with God is eternal, and His love continues to hold us, even beyond death.

Psalm 23:4

"Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff comfort me."

Psalm 23 is a classic source of comfort during times of fear. It speaks of God's presence even in the darkest moments, including the "valley of the shadow of death." This verse reminds us that we do not face death alone; God is always with us, quiding and protecting us.



STAY GROUNDED THIS CHRISTMAS SEASON

Advent and Christmas can be a magical time, but the hustle and bustle of the secular season can leave the calmest person feeling overwhelmed. Stay grounded by honoring your priorities, making time to recharge, and focusing on Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Honor your priorities: Setting and keeping priorities will help streamline your holiday schedule. An example of "holiday priorities" might including spending time with loved ones, taking time for daily prayer, and refusing to overspend. You'll feel more at peace because you're putting first things first.

Making time to recharge: Remember the importance of getting enough rest, especially when juggling extra social commitments, projects, decorating, and traveling. Resting takes any form that helps you feel refreshed – napping, praying, walking, reading, listening to music.


