

ASSISTED SUICIDE Not in Illinois!

With only days before Christmas, it's unfortunate that we need to bring this news to your attention now, but should we wait until after the holy days, it will be too late! On Feb. 9, 2024, State senator Linda Holmes, introduced legislation to legalize physician assisted suicide into the Illinois General Assembly as

Senate Bill 3499, "End-of-Life Options for Terminally III Patients Act." The Catholic Conference of Illinois expects that the IL State Senate will try to pass SB 3499 to legalize assisted suicide during the Lame Duck session that runs Jan. 2-7, 2025. What a sad start to a new year! We have no time to lose!

Please contact your state senator and representative and tell them you are opposed to Senate Bill 3499!

In keeping with our faith traditions, legalizing assisted suicide goes against everything Jesus taught about the sanctity and dignity of human life. It undermines the value of each human person, particularly those who are vulnerable.

Laws permitting assisted suicide pose significant risks to the poor, marginalized, and disabled, who may face pressure to end their lives rather than receive the care and compassion they need and deserve. There are documented cases from states where assisted suicide has been legalized, where individuals with rare or life-threatening conditions were denied necessary medical treatment and were instead offered life-ending prescriptions.

Illinois doesn't need to legalize assisted suicide! What we truly need is increased access to quality health care, enhanced palliative care options, and loving, compassionate support services for those at the end of their life! These are the alternatives that uphold the dignity of every person.

We know how busy you are this time of year but we need everyone's help! Stand up for the Gospel of Life and contact your state senator and representative today!

(Practicing) Catholic The Heroic Moment

I once asked a wise mother how she raised her children, now all faithful adults, to value their Catholic faith.

A big part of it, she explained, was helping them get out of bed.

"We called it 'the heroic moment," she told me, referring to that time in the early morning when you have to decide if you're going to get up and face the day, or pull the covers over your head and hide.

In those hazy, half-asleep moments, most of us don't want to make the right decision. I know I don't. I'm not ready for the day. I'm not ready for the light. I'm not ready for the things I'm going to need to do, the person I'm going to need to be. It's easy to hide under the covers, in the darkness and the quiet.

"Do not be afraid," the angels tell the shepherds. Why is that the first thing they say? Because the night is dark, and the shepherds have grown used to the darkness. Maybe they have even been asleep. This sudden apparition, this announcement, does not just come as a surprise. It comes as a shock. Light can be painful if we've spent too long in the darkness.

The angels brought news of great joy. But don't trust the thesaurus because joy is not the same as pleasure. It's not even the same as happiness. It's so much more. It's so much better. But you have to choose it.

As Christians, we are called to choose joy. We are called to let in the light, to cast off the yoke, to stand up out of the darkness. We are called to face the heroic moments.



May this light which reminds us of Jesus' True Presence in the Sanctuary Welcome him into eternal peace.


