Ask the Padre...

Answer: Our church is a house of prayer, and whether the Eucharist is exposed in the monstrance for Adoration or kept secure inside the Tabernacle, we should always maintain a prayerful silence in God's House so as not to interrupt anyone who is conversing with Him. Apparently, my own attempts haven't been successful. So, I suggest that next time someone's loud conversation distract you while you're trying to pray, kindly approach them and remind them where they are. You might even consider inviting them to pray with you! If that doesn't work, go back to your pew, kneel down again and ask God to shut them up!


The Gift of Love: God

What does Gaudete mean?

Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin.

During the season of Advent, we await the celebration of Christ's birth and His coming again at the end of time. Over four weeks, we prepare our hearts for Christmas in penitential reflection. But in the middle of the season, Gaudete Sunday calls us to rejoice in hope!

Why do we light a pink candle on Gaudete Sunday?

The Catholic Church uses the color rose to indicate a joyful feast day or holiday.



Gaudete Sunday's counterpart in Lent is Laetare Sunday, another break in penance to rejoice in hope as we approach Easter. During both days, a priest will usually wear rose vestments.

(Practicing) Catholic Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments Asking the Question

I have found in my life that if I am certain of the answer to a big and complicated question—right away, no doubts or hesitations—there is a high likelihood that the answer is actually the wrong one.

Because most of the time the truth is buried beneath a thicket of pride, prejudice, and ignorance. To find our answers, we have to be ready to put the gardening gloves on and pick through the thorns. We have to pray. We have to reflect. We have to question ourselves and others. We have to examine our feelings. And then we have to pray some more.

See, I would be willing to bet that the tax collectors and soldiers knew. Deep in their hearts, they knew.

They knew when they approached John the Baptist and asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" that his reply was *not* going to be: "Keep doing exactly what you're doing."

They had heard this guy preach. They knew what he was about: repentance. They might not have known exactly what John the Baptist was going to tell them to do, but they knew whatever it was, it was going to be a challenge. It was going to turn their lives upside down.

I give them credit for asking the question. That's a hard thing to do, and I don't do it enough. Too often, I'm afraid to ask the question.

How do I love this person? How do I live out my baptismal call in this particular situation? How do I draw water from the fountain of salvation—and how do I do it with joy, as we are commanded by the Psalms?

Christmas is ten days away. Are we asking the question?



Third Sunday of Advent

The third candle of Advent symbolizes Joy. As we continue to approach Christmas Day, our joy grows more and more. It takes us back to the joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men. On this third Sunday of Advent, which the Church calls "Gaudete Sunday," meaning rejoice or praise, we light the third candle and rejoice like the shepherds. For this reason, it is called the "Shepherd's Candle." and its color is pink, the liturgical color for joy.
