The Angelus, Explained

The Incarnation of Christ changed the life of every Christian person who ever lived. Reflecting on that moment in salvation history is opportunity for grace, Growth and peace. Who wouldn't want that every day, or even three times every day?

The Angelus is composed of three antiphons which narrate the Annunciation, each followed by the recitation of a Hail Mary (*a prayer that itself contains the "angelic greeting" of the angel Gabriel*). Its name is derived from the first words of the prayer in Latin.

This devotion was developed over the course of several centuries and is rooted in the ancient practice of saying the Hail Mary three times each evening. Historically, people were called to prayer by the ringing of Church bells—*"the Angelus bells."* Most people who recite the Angelus do so daily at noon, though it is often said in the morning, at noon and in the evening.

Why do Catholics Venerate Crucifixes?

Many mainline protestant churches will have a cross in their sanctuary. However, in Catholic Churches and homes, a Crucifix is displayed for veneration, which is a cross with an image of our Lord on it.



Its' not meant to remind us of something morbid or grotesque. Rather, its' a reminder of the greatest event that ever happened in the entire world: that God became man, died and rose, and opened the gates of heaven for all of us! So, next time you look at a Crucifix, pay attention to the wounds on Jesus' hands, His feet and side. Then remember what St. Paul says: "We preach Christ crucified, the power of God. Do not allow the cross of Christ to be emptied of its' power." Even Bishop Fulton Sheen said, "Keep your eyes fixed on the Crucifix, for Jesus without His cross, is a man without a mission. And a cross without Jesus. is a burden without a reliever." So, next time someone tells you that they don't have a body on their church's cross because they believe

that Christ has been raised, and they proceed to ask why you have the Lord's corpus on your cross, teach them that the Crucifix is intended for us, not Jesus! It is a daily reminder that we have to die to ourselves if we are going to rise with Jesus someday.

Mini Reflection: Jesus didn't come to fix the brokenness of the world. He came to fix *our* brokenness. He offers us not relief from the trials of life, but an answer to the question of how to live in joy, in love and in purpose in the midst of these evil days.

These Evil Days

"Alas, that these evil days should be mine." If you've ever seen "The Lord of the Rings," you might recognize this quote from "The Two Towers." The words are spoken by King Theoden at the grave of his only son and heir, as Theoden contemplates the coming war for Middle Earth, a war which has already claimed the life of his son, a war he wants no part of, a war that seems utterly hopeless and unwinnable.

These evil days.

You don't have to be a fantasy enthusiast or even a Tolkien fan to identify with Theoden here. We have all experienced this same feeling of despair, perhaps increasingly in this age of technology and social media, when the ills of the whole world — violence, injustice, moral disorder and chaos — are in our faces, on our phones, looming over our days.

But when we despair like this, we forget an important truth: this is the time of fulfillment, and we are lucky enough to be living through it.

Yes, the world is broken. It was broken two thousand years ago, too, when Jesus stood up in the synagogue on the Sabbath and read the words of the prophet Isaiah: *"He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives...and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."*

Jesus didn't come to fix the brokenness of the world. He came to fix *our* brokenness. He offers us not relief from the trials of life, but an answer to the question of how to live in joy, in love and in purpose in the midst of these evil days.


